Medical Services

YES! WE'RE OPEN

Medical services provides dental, medical, optical and podiatry care to our patients. Our healthcare team of providers includes Pediatric and Family Practice Physicians, Family Nurse Practitioners, Physician Assistants, Dentists, Optometrists, visiting Podiatrist, and supportive staff. Telehealth and inperson appointments available.

Dental

- Hygiene exams and cleaning
- Oral cancer screenings
- Oral surgery
- Fluoride treatments
- Impressions or repairs for partials/dentures
- Nutrition counseling

Optical

- Routine eye exams
- Evaluation and treatment of minor eye infections
- Contact lens fitting
- Ordering of eyeglasses and contact lenses
- Adjustments/minor eyeglass repair
- Post-op and recheck visits










Medical



- Primary care: Acute care of injury and illness, lab, radiology, and mammography
- Medication-assisted treatment (MAT): Includes medications and behavioral health support for substance use disorders
- Smoking cessation: Approaches include counseling, behavior therapy, medicines, and nicotine-containing products (gum, lozenges, nasal sprays, and more)



- Reproductive care: Prenatal care, contraceptives, and all other matters relating to the reproductive system at all stages of life
- Chronic diabetes management: Team-based diabetes management for all ages and stages
- Weight management: Care that includes nutrition, exercise, and behavioral therapy approaches
- Podiatry: Care that deals with the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of foot and leg disorders
- Sports physicals & Well-child: Including preparticipation physical evaluation for sports, healthy development and behavior, immunizations, and illness prevention
- LGBT2Q+ care: Comprehensive and sensitive care, including gender-affirming medical treatment











Pharmacy

Pharmacy operations are located at the Ho-Chunk Health Care Center in Black River Falls, WI, and the House of Wellness Clinic in Baraboo, WI. Our locations provide pharmacy services to Native American/American Indian enrolled members of any Federally Recognized Tribe, non-Tribal HCN Employees, and any person presenting with a valid prescription. Telehealth and in-person appointments available.

Prescription Refill and Pick-Up

- In-person and prescription mail-out
- Prescriptions accessible through the RxLocal App and users refill medications, receive notifications, and send secure messages
- Med Sync Program or automatic prescription refill service to keep you from running out of medications



Patient Education/Treatment

- Narcan training: Training provided in a group setting or individually
- **Smoking cessation**: Education and medication prescribing







- Diabetes management: Education and medication
 - Psychiatry services: Medication-assisted treatment for addiction services, treatment for Hepatitis C and sexually
 - Reproductive health: Including contraceptive prescriptions (pill, patch, ring, or shot), emergency contraceptives, and testing for pregnancy or STIs


 Herbal medicine garden: Located at House of Wellness only, includes vegetables and herbal plants. Educational events hosted by Community Health, Health & Wellness Program






Environmental Health

Environmental Health works to identify environmental hazards in water, soil, and air sources. Other programs include injury prevention/emergency preparedness, food sanitation, vector control, construction projects, institutional environmental health, and assistance in Public Health Accreditation.

- Water quality: Includes community water sources and private well/septic; free water testing and assistance with emergency situations
 - Free well/septic construction (depends on available funding, and must be first well/septic at primary residence)
- Air quality: Environmental assessments for mold and radon; outdoor air assessments near tribal communities
- Injury prevention: Free car seats and bike helmets
- Code compliance/health reporting: Inspections for Ho-Chunk facilities including food, lodging, and childcare; investigation of environmental hazard complaints submitted by the community and resources for property members on regulation/law compliance.









- Surface water monitoring: Includes assessing ecosystem health, addressing environmental issues, and management
- Wetlands delineation: Review of Ho-Chunk properties to identify and monitor water-loving plants and other wetland characteristics' verification of wetlands and establishment of their boundaries to ensure compliance with state law
- Solid waste/wastewater management: Program works to reduce waste, transport, treat, and store it among all Ho-Chunk properties
- Institutional environmental health: Works with infection control to ensure the Department of Health maintains a safe environment for clients, including oversight of construction projects
- Emergency preparedness: Identifies needs and develops tools to assist the Ho-Chunk Nation in preparing for and responding to natural and manmade emergencies

Public Health

The Division of Public Health provides disease prevention and monitoring, connecting community members to health resources, providing health education, assessing community needs, implementing health fairs, and Public Health Accreditation

- Maternal and child health: Including 1-on-1 appointments, Partners in Parenting, Safe Sleep education, First Breath, and vaccines
- Certified lactation counseling: 1-on-1 assistance with breastfeeding to include latching, returning to work, and milk supply
- HIV and STI prevention: Including testing, education, and other resources for prevention
- Communicable disease: Management, education, and follow-up/reporting to protect the public from outbreaks
- Suicide prevention: Question, persuade, refer (QPR) suicide prevention training. Offered virtual or in person.
- Women, infants, and children (WIC): Intake into WIC program and health screenings for enrollment/certification
- Immunization reminders: Phone calls, postcards, or other reminders to help you stay up-to-date on your vaccines
- Disease investigation: Direct community outreach for communicable disease mitigation











Division of Public Health

Community Health Representative Program

- **Prevention programs:** Partners in Parenting and other monthly programs for community members on various prevention topics
- Family Spirit: A home visiting program for parents from pregnancy to three years post-partum; education includes prenatal care, infant care, child development, healthy living, and more
- **Resources and referrals:** Connecting community members to resources to meet their health needs and other prevention-based referrals; transportation to medical appointments
- Car seats: Car seat safety checks, education, and other support









Community Health

The Community Health division is comprised of Home Health, Health and Wellness, and the Food Distribution Program. We provide skilled nursing care to our elders and nutrition education to Ho-Chunk enrolled tribal members and other federally recognized tribal members. We are dedicated to promoting a healthy lifestyle while preserving Ho-Chunk traditions.

Home Health Nursing

- General to skilled nursing care: Diabetic food care, health screenings, and other nursing care; services offered throughout our seven health offices
- **CNA caregiver services**: Includes services for medical needs, activities of daily living, transportation to medical appointments, and respite services.





Food Distribution

Commodity foods: Offers a variety of food to eligible participants that meet USDA eligibility guidelines; food is shared in seven different locations in Wisconsin and includes a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables, frozen meats, whole grains, and traditional foods










Health and Wellness

- Balancing Your Life: Diabetes management topics include physical activity, nutrition, blood sugar monitoring, treating hypoglycemia, and other topics
- Prevent T2 Diabetes Prevention Program: A year of education and support to increase physical activity and promote weight loss; topics include nutrition and physical activity, stress management, coping with triggers, and getting support



- Nutrition: Personalized 1-on-1 nutrition sessions with our Nutritionist; support includes education, support, and creation of nutrition plans
- Community Supported Agriculture (CSA):
 Collaboration between Ho-Chunk Nation and local partners that bring fresh vegetables during summer months; must apply for the program and complete a farmer agreement
- Fitness membership reimbursement: Reimburses costs associated with fitness centers for up to six months; must be an approved fitness center and attend the center a certain number of times per month















Quality Improvement

The Division of Quality Improvement supports internal Health Department efforts on quality improvement studies, infection prevention and safety, risk management, health data, employee training, workforce development, performance management, and additional programs to meet and maintain AAAHC and PHAB standards of care.

- Infection control: includes health care institutional infection control, risk assessments, education, and mitigation strategies
- Employee health: includes tracking, monitoring, and education for Health Department employee illnesses to ensure a healthy workforce
- Epidemiology: Includes primary and secondary data analysis for health outcomes, annual population health reports, health service research efforts
- Quality improvement/compliance: Includes internal guidance on creating a culture of continuous quality improvement, implementing PDSA cycles, and adherence to AAAHC and PHAB accreditation standards











What is accreditation?

The purpose of accreditation is to improve the quality of practice and performance, develop leadership, and strengthen relationships essential to health services.

Accrediting Organizations:

- AAAHC- The Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care ensures the health department clinical performance is aligned with nationally recognized health care standards.
- PHAB- The Public Health Accreditation Board ensures the health department is aligned with best public health practices through nationally recognized, practice-focused, and evidence-based standards.

The QI Division also develops:

- Quality Improvement and Performance Management (QIPM) Plan
- Workforce Development Plan
- Client Satisfaction Reports
- Public/Environmental Health Profiles —
- Annual Health Department trainings







Behavioral Health

The Division of Behavioral Health provides unique services that integrate Ho-Chunk cultural values and beliefs with current best practice models. Staff include: Dual Diagnosis Therapists, Advance Practice Social Workers, Licensed Clinical Social Workers, Licensed Professional Counselors, Certified Substance Abuse Counselors, Peer Support Specialists, Advance Practice Pharmacist, Family Nurse Practitioner and contractual Psychologist. Telehealth and in-person appointments available.

- Assessment and referral: Includes inpatient/outpatient treatment coordination, Empowering Women program, Vocational Rehabilitation for Native Americans (VRNA), domestic violence advocate, community education, Peer Support services
- Counseling/ therapy services: Includes group, individual, adults, adolescents, family, children (ages 5+), marriage, couples, parenting, telehealth, Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT)
- **Psychiatric services:** Psychiatric referrals, medication evaluation and review, treatment planning and review.











- Psychological services: Includes psychological evaluations
- Hosto Pii Hocire: Women's recovery house
- Group and individual offerings: Includes perinatal mental health, grief support, Mothers of Tradition, Get Your Loved One Sober, art therapy, Dialectical Behavioral Therapy (DBT), Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing Therapy (EDMR), parent/child interaction therapy, Wellbriety 12 steps for women, Fatherhood is Sacred ® Motherhood is Sacred, Linking Generations® by Strengthening Relationships
- Residential evaluation treatment/coordination of care: Including coverage of outpatient costs for clients who need a higher level of care; when grant funding is available. Ho-Chunk descendants and other tribal members are eligible for services

Health Benefits

Our benefit coordinator advocates can assist members in finding alternate resources to pay for medical services, enroll them in available programs, and help maintain their eligibility. In-person and telephone appointments available.

- Medicaid/Badgercare+ or other health insurances available through the marketplace: Assistance in finding available health insurances
- Social Security: Enrollment assistance
- Social Security Disability Income: Enrollment assistance
- Well Women Program: Provides preventive health screening services to women with little or no health insurance coverage, this includes things like mammogram screenings, Pap tests, and cervical cancer among others
- Purchased/ Referred Care (Contract Health):
 This program is considered a 'last resort' to pay for medical or dental services outside of our tribal healthcare facilities; it is not considered insurance or an entitlement plan.
- Food Share: Wisconsin's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, or SNAP





Finance

The Division of Finance, led by the Chief Financial Officer, includes accountants, grants managers, billers, and medical coders. These staff provide financial and accounting support to ensure the Department of Health continues to be a leading Tribal Health Enterprise, while ensuring fiscal responsibility.







Health Information Systems

The Division of Health Information Systems (HIS) supports the Health Department by bringing on new, state-of-the-art healthcare technology to provide the best care possible. HIS also provides network tracking & monitoring, electronic medical record systems management, data security, software & equipment maintenance, and technical support for staff.
